GOD'S DESIGN

Your family is part of God's perfect plan for creation. He formed it with the purpose of passing on the love, knowledge, understanding, and fear of God. The family is designed to be the primary evangelism and discipleship context for the next generation.

The responsibility for raising children with a firmly rooted, authentic faith, according to the Bible, belongs to the parents. You carry more weight in the life of your child than anyone else. Parents are to impress the commands of God on their children in everyday life as they walk along the road, as they sit at home, when they lie down, and when they get up.

But, while this primary responsibility is in your hands, God's intention is not that you go it alone. God has created the church to partner with families in the mission of reaching future generations with the message of the gospel. Together, the church and the home are to be partners in ministry to the next generation.

At Berean, we *train and equip parents* as the primary spiritual lead in their children's lives. We want to serve as "another voice" in the life of your child. Our goals are to come alongside your child, and to join hands with you as parents in this journey as you lead them toward an understanding of who God is, what He has done, and what He has promised He will do.



THE FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP PLAN

We have created a strategy to partner with parents providing for maximum spiritual impact in the life of a child. The Family Discipleship Plan provides a map for parents to follow in the discipling process of their child and an avenue for the church to train and equip parents.

This strategy, together with participation in Berean's educational programming for kids and youth, offers a framework of partnership influencing the life of your children and youth. We are unified with parents working toward the goal of launching young adults who are firmly rooted in an authentic faith and on-mission for the gospel.



NAVIGATING THE MAP









Berean's Family Ministry areas—Kids, Preteen, Middle School, High School—are our transit lines. These routes signify a family's journey toward increased knowledge, understanding, and faith in God. Parents and children follow a route until they gain core competencies and intersect with critical milestones.



Each milestone acts as a marker, and offers a celebration event to recognize spiritual development in a child's life. At each age level, families switch onto the next transit line and work toward the corresponding milestone. Families can hop on board any line to begin their journey with the Family Discipleship Plan.

Core Competencies: Parent as spiritual leader, trainer, evangelist, and discipler

Our first milestone is Child Dedication. During one of our FaithFamily Celebrations, typically by the time your child is 18 months old, you publicly commit your child to the Lord and devote yourself to taking the spiritual lead in your child's life. In turn, the church body promises to partner with you in guiding your child's faith development. At Berean we provide training and resources to prepare you as your child's primary faith trainer.
