

# **Christ is Life: To Live is Christ**

Philippians 1:19-26

## Read Philippians 1:19-26 together:

"For I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, <sup>20</sup> as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. <sup>21</sup> For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. <sup>22</sup> If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. <sup>23</sup> I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. <sup>24</sup> But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. <sup>25</sup> Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, <sup>26</sup> so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again."

- ? What is happening in Paul's life that would cause him to think in terms of life and death (Philippians 1:12-13)?
- ? What circumstances in your life make you think of life and death?
- ? What words in verses 19-20 show the posture of Paul's heart?

## To Live is Christ

- 1. Clarity for the journey (see verse 21)

  - ? Think about last week. What evidence in your life shows that you do or do not see this as the purpose for your life?

### 2. Confidence in the destination (see verses 21-23)

- ? How many euphemisms for death can you come up with? What's the purpose of these euphemisms?
- ? How does truly living for Christ transform your view of death?

? Think about this coming week. How would remembering your destination change the way you live this week?

### 3. Paul's decision (see verses 24-26)

- ? What does Paul choose? Why?
- ? Who in your life spurs you on toward progress (sanctification) and joyful faith?
- ? Who in your life could you encourage toward progress and joyful faith this week?
