Message and Methods

1 Peter 3:13-17

Now who is there to harm you if you are zealous for what is good? But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil.

Proof Positive:

The word of God is not the evidence of our conversion and relationship with God **BUT**:

Our conversion and relationship with God is the evidence of the word of God

Road to Hope:

"When confronted with suffering that won't go away or even a minor problem, we instinctively focus on what is missing, such as the lost coats and the betrayal in Joseph's story, not on the masters hand. Often when you think everything has gone wrong, it's just that you're in the middle of a story. If you watch the stories God is weaving in your life, you, like Joseph, will begin to see the patterns. You'll become a poet, sensitive to your father's voice." -Paul Miller
