What Kids Will Learn: Kids are starting a new unit called, "The Way – Who is Jesus?". Kids will be learning what the Bible teaches about Jesus. How is He different than all other people? What did He do on earth? How did Jesus live? Ultimately, your child will learn about the cross of Christ and be challenged to discover how Jesus changes lives. For kids who already have a relationship with Christ, we hope these meetings will deepen their understanding of who He is. For kids who have not yet experienced salvation, our hope is that these lessons would provide even more fuel for a growing fire of faith.

This week kids will learn what John preached to people in the wilderness, "Jesus is coming! Repent!" He told people to ask forgiveness for their sins and obey God. He told people that God sent Jesus to earth to save us from the punishment of sin. And that's what Jesus did!

Team KID Task: Kids are to make a list of 5 things they think of when they think of Jesus.

At-Home Activity: Get creative this week with your kids and become detectives! Staple several pieces of paper together to make an "investigator's" notebook. Make a creative cover with construction paper. As a family, search through your Bible and record all the prophecies concerning Jesus' birth, life, resurrection or ascension. Be sure to include the Old Testament prophecies as well as the New Testament fulfillments. Here are a few to get you started. Read these passages together and add them to your notebooks: Micah 5:2; Isaiah 7:14; Hosea 11:1; Psalm 2:7; and Zechariah 11:12-13.

Unit Theme: DIY – Forgiveness is Up to You

Unit Bible Verse: Colossians 3:13

Unit Overview: This unit teaches about forgiveness. Right from the start, God made a way for Adam and Eve to have a relationship with Him again. The same is true for us. No matter how much we mess up, God will always make a way to forgive us. When it comes to forgiveness, we can also look to Jesus, who chose to forgive even those who were crucifying Him. Because of God's amazing forgiveness, we should work hard to forgive others.

Unit Bottom Line: Deciding that someone who has wronged you doesn't have to pay.

What Kids Will Learn This Week: Kids will learn about Zacchaeus and how Jesus chose to forgive all the wrong he had done, and as a result, Zacchaeus was radically changed from the inside out. Kids will learn that since the very beginning of time, God has always made a way for forgiveness. God had a plan to fix our relationship with Him. The greatest act of forgiveness was when He sent Jesus. As Jesus lived His life on earth, He showed forgiveness by the way He treated people. Kids will hear, "It is our job is to reflect God with our words and actions. It means we forgive others just like God has forgiven us. And when you do that, you never know—God could also completely change them, too. When we forgive others, it can be powerful in their lives!"

At-Home: After Wednesday, engage in discussion with your child by asking the questions:

- What was in this week's *So & So Show*? (What was the Bible story? What was funny?)
- Ask: What does it feel like to be forgiven?

Additional Activity: While having a meal together, engage in a Q&A.

- Q&A for *Parents*: What's the biggest restoration project (e.g. room makeover, house flip, etc.) you've ever taken on?
- Q&A for *Kids*: What's the biggest thing someone's ever forgiven you for doing? How did you feel before and after? *Parents*: *Share an experience of your own too.*
