How Does Jesus Relate to Believers?

Luke 2

Jesus' Birth

Memory Verse: Hebrews 4:15

Missions Emphasis: Lesotho, Africa

What Kids Will Learn: Kids are in a unit called, “The Way – Who is Jesus?”. Kids will be learning what the Bible teaches about Jesus. How is He different than all other people? What did He do on earth? How did Jesus live? Ultimately, your child will learn about the cross of Christ and be challenged to discover how Jesus changes lives. For kids who already have a relationship with Jesus, we hope these meetings will deepen their understanding of who He is. For kids who have not yet experienced salvation, our hope is that these lessons would provide even more fuel for a growing fire of faith.

This week kids will learn that Jesus was both fully God and fully man. God sent Jesus to earth in human form, just like we are! He felt all of the emotions that we do: pain, joy, excitement, and sadness. The Bible says that Jesus was even tempted to do wrong. Nevertheless, He did not act on those temptations but remained sinless throughout His life.

Team KID Task: Kids are to write or draw three ways that they are like Jesus when He was a kid.

At-Home Activity: Make a scrapbook of Jesus’ birthday! First, talk about the day that your child was born. Look at pictures of your child documenting the progression of his or her life story. Explain that the Bible contains the only “scrapbook” of Jesus’ life that we have. Then make an illustrated scrapbook of Jesus’ life. Ask, “If cameras had been around during Jesus’ lifetime, what moments would have been captured on camera and included in the scrapbook?” Cut pictures and words from magazines or draw them out together.

Jesus Teaches on Forgiveness

Unit Theme: DIY – Forgiveness is Up to You

Unit Bible Verse: Colossians 3:13

Unit Overview: This unit teaches about forgiveness. Right from the start, God made a way for Adam and Eve to have a relationship with Him again. The same is true for us. No matter how much we mess up, God will always make a way to forgive us. When it comes to forgiveness, we can also look to Jesus, who chose to forgive even those who were crucifying Him. Because of God's amazing forgiveness, we should work hard to forgive others.

Unit Bottom Line: Deciding that someone who has wronged you doesn't have to pay.

What Kids Will Learn This Week: Kids will learn about what Jesus taught on forgiveness from His Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5:23-24, *So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift.*

Jesus is saying we are NOT fine when we don't apologize and make things right. Before we do anything else, we should make things right with that other person. Sometimes we need to ask for forgiveness and sometime we are the one who needs to do the forgiving.

At-Home: After Wednesday, engage in discussion with your child by asking the questions:

- What was in this week's *So & So Show*? (What was the Bible story? What was funny?)
- Ask: What is keeping you from forgiving?

Additional Activity: At bedtime, talk about forgiveness. Say:

God says that loving others means making the first move. Whether you need to be forgiven or whether you need to forgive, if something is wrong between you and someone else, you need to take a step to make things right. You might even say that choosing to make peace with others through forgiveness is one of the best gifts you can give God! Pray that God will help you make the first move to forgive.
